

# **VETT 115**-VET ANESTHESIA & SURGICAL ASSISTING I 2 CREDITS

#### **S**YLLABUS

#### **CATALOG DESCRIPTION**

This course is an entry-level course designed to develop a strong foundation of anesthesia and surgical knowledge and skills. Topics covered include aseptic surgical preparations, working knowledge and understanding of the sterile technique, a detailed overview of the basic equipment and pharmaceuticals used in anesthesia, proper monitoring of anesthestetized patients, post-anesthesia care, and proper sanitation and preparation of surgical supplies and facilities. This course will act as a foundation of learning for subsequent courses in veterinary anesthesia and surgical assisting
