

FIRE-151 INTERMEDIATE FIRE LAB 2 CREDITS

SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This course encompasses the principals and skills from Fire Fighter I in a practical setting and gives the student practical experience with fire attack, rescue, and all of the support functions associated with fire incidents and fire department response. Students participate in practical evolutions of fire behavior, interior fire attack, car fires, and liquid petroleum fires.

3. Operate in actual live fire environments on the intricate techniques of hose stream handling and fire attack.
4. Anticipate incident needs and function in a proactive manner to bring the incident to a safe and effective close.

GENERAL LEARNING OBJECTIVES

1. Participate in all evolutions as a member of a team.
2. Demonstrate the ability to select the appropriate hose line and deploy it for use in the extinguishment of fires.
3. Demonstrate the ability to rescue persons trapped and injured in fire incidents.
4. Demonstrate the ability to function safely and effectively as a member of a team and individual throughout the course.
5. Initiate the response to a reported emergency.
6. Receive a business or personal telephone call.
7. Transmit and receive messages via the fire department radio.
8. Use SCBA during emergency operations.
9. Respond on apparatus to an emergency scene.
10. Operate in established work areas at emergency scenes.
11. Force entry into a structure.
12. Exit a hazardous area as a team.
13. Set up ground ladders.
14. Attack a passenger vehicle fire operating as a member of a team.
15. Extinguish fires in exterior Class A materials.
16. Conduct a search and rescue in a structure operating as a member of a team.
17. Perform horizontal ventilation on a structure operating as part of a team.
18. Perform vertical ventilation on a structure as part of a team.
19. Overhaul a fire scene.
20. Conserve property as a member of a team.
21. Connect a fire department pumper to a water supply as a member of a team.
22. Extinguish incipient Class A, Class B fires.
23. Illuminate the emergency scene.
24. Turn off building utilities.
25. Combat a ground cover fire operating as a member of a team.
26. Perform a fire safety survey in a private dwelling.
27. Present fire safety information to station visitors or small groups.
28. Clean and check ladders, ventilation equipment, self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), ropes, salvage equipment and hand tools.
29. Clean, inspect, and return fire hose to service.
30. Complete a basic incident report.
31. Communicate the need for team assistance.
32. Extinguish an ignitable liquid fire, operating as a member of a team.
33. Protect evidence of fire cause and origin.
34. Assist rescue operation teams.
35. Maintain power plants, power tools, and lighting equipment.
