

FIRE-161 BASIC WILDLAND FIREFIGHTING 2 CREDITS

SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This training consists of 4 basic Firefighter courses required by the National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) and provides the training and information required by NWCG. Students who successfully complete the coursework and pass the physical fitness test earn "red card" certification required to work on forest fires or to participate in prescribed fires. This course is a prerequisite for all other wild land fire-related training and employment.

- 1. Identify and discuss the three sides of the fire triangle.
- 2. Identify the environmental factors of fuels, weather and topography that affect the start and spread of wildland fire.
- 3. Describe the contributing factors that indicate the potential for increased fire behavior that may compromise safety.
- 4. Explain what the LCES (Lookouts, Communications, Escape Routes, and Safety Zones) system is and how it relates to the Standard Firefighting Orders.
- 5. Construct fire line to required standards using various methods.
- 6. Strengthen, reinforce, and use holding actions on a fire line.
- 7. Extinguish the fire with or without the use of water.
- 8. Complete assigned tasks in a safe and efficient manner.
