6. Display appropriate personality, attitude and habits in human relations in a lab setting.
7. Describe preventative measures of bacteria and viruses to prevent spread of diseases.
8. Use proper procedures and precautions used in barbershops.
9. Apply the pH scale and values associated with water, acids, and alkalines when perming mannequin.
10. Practice simple safety and first-aid applications for minor burns, cuts, choking, eye injury, and fainting.
11. Apply the theory of hair, hair formation, growth, structure, behavior, and color on a mannequin.
12. Evaluate the hair for common hair disorders, including hair loss.
13. Practice proper draping, shampooing and scalp massage services.
14. Apply proper communication skills during the mock consultations.
15. Use design elements and principles used to compose designs on headsheets.
16. Correct unbalanced proportions when creating a design for the mannequin.
17. Select haircutting tools, areas of the head, and fundamental cutting techniques.
18. Practice appropriate communication skills during the client consultation.
19. Exhibit basic hair coloring techniques.
20. Apply thermal styling techniques using infection control and safety on a mannequin.
21. Practice identifying natural level and tone, artificial level, tone and intensity.
22. Study and learn a basic facial.
