

## **ENGL 2610-AMERICAN LITERATURE I 3 CREDITS**

### **SYLLABUS**

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#### **CATALOG DESCRIPTION**

This course surveys American literature from the colonial period to the mid-nineteenth century. This course provides students with the contexts and documents necessary to understand the origins of American Literature and the aesthetic, cultural, and ideological debates central to early American culture.

1. To read and think critically about each text, analyzing literary elements and interpreting meaning.

- a) Read representative texts from American literary canon, identifying literary elements and common themes
  - b) Make connections, draw conclusions, and interact with ideas presented in reading selections
  - c) Understand some of the historical and cultural forces that have influenced the writings of American literature
  - d) Gain an appreciation for the many voices that make up American literature
2. To generate reflective and academic writing about literature using primary and secondary sources
- a) Generate academic papers focusing on literary texts and using MLA documentation
  - b) Generate essays and answers to exam questions with significant analysis and treatment of topic
  - c) Generate essays and answers to exam questions that draw connections amongst texts and that identify cultural and historical forces that influenced those texts
  - d) Generate essays and answers to exam questions that demonstrate understanding of diversity of American literary canon
  - e) Understand and apply standard conventions of writing (spelling, grammar, punctuation, usage, diction, syntax)
3. To interact orally as a means of sharing ideas and extending experience.
- a) Listen and contribute with respect and honesty in all group discussions
  - b) Demonstrate understanding of cultural and historical forces, make connections amongst texts, show appreciation of diversity of texts in one oral presentation
