

ENGL-2110 Traditional Grammar 3 credits

SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This course surveys traditional grammar, introducing linguistic terminology and methods for identifying and understanding parts of speech, parts of sentences and basic sentence patterns. The course presents terminology and methods designed to increase the student's understanding of the structure of the language.

1. Students will know basic terminology associated with the study of English grammar and parts of speech.

- a. Recognize and identify parts of speech and other grammar terminology [*BSL]
- b. Describe various functions of parts of speech, phrases, and clauses [CT / EC]
- c. Apply knowledge of grammar terminology in diagramming sentences [CT]
- 2. Students will recognize syntactic structure and patterns.
 - a. Recognize, identify, and produce sentence structures, including declarative, interrogative, imperative and exclamatory sentences [BSL]
 - b. Recognize, identify, and produce simple, compound and complex sentences and their components [BSL / CT]
 - c. Apply knowledge of syntax patterns in diagramming sentences [BSL / CT]
- 3. Students will be able to diagram common sentences using traditional grammar diagrams.
 - a. Describe form and function of traditional diagrams [BSL / CT]
 - b. Apply knowledge of traditional grammar to analyzing and diagramming sentences [CT]
- 4. Students will demonstrate the ability to explain basic grammar skills and teach grammar in the context of reading and writing.
 - a. Examine differences in spoken and written use of language [CT / EC]
 - b. Examine the difference between prescriptive and descriptive grammar [CT / BSL]
 - c. Reflect on learning through writing a journal [BSL / CT / EC]
 - d. Apply what has been learned in class through class presentations [CT / EC]
