

VETT 223 - VIDEO CAPSTONE VETERINARY NURSING II 2 CREDITS**SYLLABUS**

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Video Portfolio Veterinary Nursing II is an advanced level course specifically designed to instruct students in the performance of required hands-on clinical tasks for veterinary nursing. Students will be required to produce and submit a video on specific and required veterinary nursing tasks. The video is requirement for all veterinary technology program students based on AVMA/CVTEA accreditation criteria.

Prerequisites: VETT-210, VETT-212, and student must have approved hospital and preceptor.

Semester Offered: Spring, Summer, and Fall semesters.

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

During this course, the student will be required to...

Videotape and demonstrate proficiency per CVTEA and SJC VTDLP standards (as outlined in the course video instructions document) for the following tasks:

- restrain a dog for cephalic venipuncture
- restrain a dog for saphenous venipuncture
- restrain a dog or cat for jugular venipuncture
- give an intramuscular injection to a dog AND cat
- give an intravenous injection to a dog AND cat
- place a cephalic intravenous catheter
- place a saphenous intravenous catheter
- perform a Schirmer tear test
- perform a fluorescein stain test
- perform tonometry testing
- perform orogastric intubation
- perform a dental prophylaxis/examination
