CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This course shows fire and emergency medical apparatus operators how to use defensive driving techniques to maneuver safely through traffic under severe time constraints and stress. This includes hands on training with a state of the art driving simulator and fire apparatus. This course meets the National Safety Council requirements for driving emergency apparatus. This course meets CEVO and EVOC requirements.
