

RESP-240 CLINICAL PRACTICUM III 5 CREDITS

SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to provide clinical experience in general diagnostic and therapeutic modalities for neonatal and pediatric patients in the clinical setting. Included are patient transport, mechanical ventilation, airway management, emergency care, and monitoring of neonatal and pediatric patients.

- 2. Select, review, obtain and interpret data:
 - A. Locate or identify pertinent data in the patient's chart.
 - B. Interpret data from patient history, clinical assessment, chest x-ray, and laboratory tests.
 - C. Demonstrate critical thinking as well as problem-solving skills.
- 3. Select, assemble and check equipment for proper function, operation, and cleanliness:
 - A. Demonstrate the set-up and operation of a transcutaneous monitor.
 - B. Demonstrate set-up and operation of oxygen devices such as oxyhood and oxygen tent.
 - C. Demonstrate airway management, airway care and the use of suctioning devices.
 - D. Demonstrate ventilator set-up, monitoring, circuit change and trouble-shooting.
 - E. Demonstrate set-up for transport of neonatal and pediatric patients.
- 4. Initiate, conduct, and modify prescribed therapeutic procedures based on patient outcomes:
 - A. Assist in pediatric advanced life support (PALS) and/or neonatal resuscitation (NRP) procedures.
 - B. Identify the criteria and demonstrate initiation of mechanical ventilation on a patient.
 - C. Demonstrate monitoring and management of patient-ventilator system.
 - D. Identify the criteria and demonstrate weaning of patients from mechanical ventilation.
- 5. Demonstrate proficiency and competency in the delivery of respiratory care procedures:
 - A. Demonstrate application of therapeutic procedures on a ventilated patient.
 - B. Recognize and identify the indications of intubation, as well as contraindications, and complications of this procedure.
 - C. Demonstrate the knowledge of the indications, contraindications and complications of extubation, as well as performance of the procedure.
 - D. Demonstrate performance of arterial blood gas sample from an umbilical artery catheter and/or capillary blood gas.
