- 2. Employ movement exercises to produce relaxed and precise stage movement
 - a) Recognize and use stage areas in blocking exercises
 - b) Recognize and use stage body positions to carry out director's blocking direction
 - c) Focus on action through pantomimic exercises to relieve stage fright
 - d) Concentrate on a character's physicality to interpret the character on the stage
- 3. Develop improvisational skills to unlock creative resources
 - a) Develop concentration and focus through improvisational exercises
 - b) Explore physical and psychological character traits though improvisational exercises
 - c) Provide justification for a character's actions through improvisational exercises
- 4. Use interpersonal communication and team skills to work on a theatrical production
 - a) Work with other students on scenes from a play
 - b) Evaluate and critique orally and in writing acting skills seen in productions and in classroom exercises
- 5. Interpret a script and character
 - a) Use critical thinking skills to analyze a play and its characters in written form
- 6. Observe and evaluate acting skills of other actors
 - a) Attend a live theatre production and critique the acting in writing
 - b) Evaluate and critique orally and in writing acting skills observed in classroom exercises
- 7. Develop audition skills
 - a) Develop dramatic and humorous monologues for auditions
 - b) Employ cold reading techniques
 - c) Fill out application forms and schedules
