Provides students with the opportunity to deepen physical, vocal, imaginative, and collaborative skills to which they were exposed in Beginning Acting. During the course of the semester, students will be introduced to techniques for working on script and character analysis, moment-to moment work, physical transformation, breath work, and truthful playing of the scene.

 - b) Improvise movement and vocal techniques through classroom exercises
 - c) Study historical periods and actin styles, if applicable to the character
 - d) Combine character analysis with physical traits to define the character by performing scenes
- 3. Develop vocal techniques
 - a) Practice correct breathing and articulation through an exercise regimen
 - b) Use phrasing, attack, follow through, and line linkage to communicate dialogue
 - c) Employ operative words correctly to convey subtext
 - d) Complete a written dialogue analysis
- 4. Develop confidence in scene study and performance
 - a) Employ acting skills techniques to rehearse scenes and/or short play
 - b) Perform in scenes and/or short play
 - c) Evaluate the performances of self and others in written and oral formats
