SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Reviews the information presented in the initial Emergency Medical Responder, Emergency Medical Technician and Advanced Emergency Medical Technician (Intermediate) courses. Fulfills the formal refresher requirements for relicensure/recertification at the New Mexico state or National Registry level. This course does not include any card certifications, such as, BLS/CPR.

Prerequisites: Current licensure or certification at one of the levels covered by the course.

Semester Offered: Spring, Summer, Fall; as needed
