This course will introduce the major intervention and treatment strategies for substance abuse. Special consideration will be given to the prediction of treatment outcomes.

This course is designed to give a broad understanding of the specific philosophies and methods of treatment utilized in addressing substance abuse/dependency issues. Students will become familiar with the origins of the

various approaches that they will encounter in the counseling and therapy processions. The students will also become familiar with the specific treatment methods that have been researched as being most effective, with various specialty populations of substance abusers; i.e. legally mandated populations, gender specific populations and populations with Co-Occurring disorders.

Objectives

- 1. Theories related to modern therapy
- 2. The impact of these theories on the development of substance abuse approaches
- 3. Understand the differences in effectiveness between inpatient and outpatient specific approaches
- 4. The potential success of substance abuse treatments on specific populations
- 5. Protocols that address Codependency and Enabling
- 6. The importance of implementation of treatment approaches that are supported by research findings

Specific Learning Outcomes

- 1. Identify the origins of modern treatment approaches
- 2. Identify empirically supported treatment protocols
- 3. Demonstrate an understanding of the various philosophies and treatment approaches used with specific treatment populations.
- 4. Demonstrate an awareness of the implications of Co-Occurring disorders on the treatment approaches used.
- 5. Design a treatment program for a "special need" population and determine an appropriate treatment approach. Determine the number of staff, licensure levels, and funding sources and identify supportive research for such a program.
