SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

Students will apply their knowledge and skills to write accurate, advanced, and professional documentation for reimbursement of occupational therapy services utilizing experiences during the work-based learning of OTAP 274. Topics include documentation throughout the stages of the occupational therapy process, intervention plans and utilizing professional literature in making evidenced-based decisions.

Prerequisites: OTAP 272 and OTAP 273 with a "C" or better. Faculty Permission

 - d. In collaboration with the Fieldwork site, create a project based on current practice evidence.
