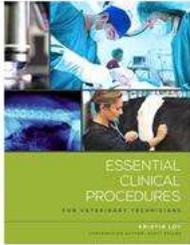
Section-specific Course Description:

Course Level Objectives

Videotape and demonstrate proficiency per CVTEA and SJC VTDLP standards (as outlined in the course video instructions document) the following tasks:

- maintain and operate an anesthetic machine
- perform pressure check of an anesthetic machine
- preanesthetic preparation
- administer anesthetic related drugs by injection, mask, induction chamber, or endotracheal tube : rapid sequence induction technique
- utilize clinical signs and appropriate equipment to monitor patient status in all stages of anesthesia
- prepare surgical site using aseptic techniques and position patient for common procedures
- wrap a surgical gown
- perform cleaning and sterilization of the surgical room
- surgical scrub: hands
- surgical gowning and gloving
- clean surgical instruments
- set up sterile surgical pack
- assemble and wrap a surgical pack
- sterilize instruments and supplies using appropriate methods
- provide post operative care: suture removal

You will find a current version of the VETT 221 Veterinary Anesthesia and Surgery Video Portfolio - Instructions and Tasks document on the course site. Please contact your instructor if you need clarification of the assignments or with any questions or concerns that you might have.

To allow enough time for your video flash drive to be graded, it must be mailed to arrive in the instructor's office by the specific due date posted each semester. Mailing instructions are located

within the video instructions document in Canvas.

The Surgery and Anesthesia Video must be submitted during the semester that you are enrolled in the VETT 221 course, and each and every task must be completed with a minimum score of 70%. The total combined scores of the video and the exams will determine your final grade for the course. If a student does not successfully complete all 14 videos in 1-2 attempts, they will fail the course and have to reattempt the class in a future semester.

Quizzes

- The introductory OSHA/course policies quiz is due at the end of Week 1 and consists of 20 multiple choice questions worth 0.5 points each for a total of 10 points. A score of 10/10 is required to be able to access the task drop boxes in order to turn in completed work each week. You have 4 attempts at this quiz and 20 minutes for each attempt.
- There are 10 quizzes for VETT 221 and each consists of 10 questions worth a maximum of 1 points each. These quizzes are based on previous course material and are review for the VTNE. The quizzes are worth 10 points each and you have 10 minutes to complete the quiz. You have 2 attempts for each quiz.
- Each Assignment/Quiz must be completed and submitted by the posted due date/time.

Spay and Neuter Requirements

All students of an AVMA accredited program must show participation in the following procedures: canine spay, canine neuter, feline spay, and feline neuter. Students complete the feline requirements in VETT 214 and will need to complete the canine requirements in VETT 221. This is required to pass the course, regardless of overall course grade. . Please see your course module for more information regarding these requirements.

Assignment Due Dates

The due dates for assignments, quizzes, and video submissions are specific to each course and are posted in the course modules. Unless noted otherwise, all assignments are due by 11:59 PM MT on the date listed. If you think you are going to need an extension on your assignments, please contact your instructor prior to the assignment due date.

If you do not have permission from your instructor to turn in work late it may be subject to point penalties or may not be accepted at all

Canvas Participation and Expectations

Students are expected to check Canvas and their SJC email daily for instructions and feedback from their instructors. All coursework should be completed by the posted due date. Extensions are given on a very limited basis and at instructor discretion. Point deductions may be applied for late work. Documentation of extenuating circumstances may be required for extensions granted.
