Section-specific Course Description:

Course Level Objectives

Student will demonstrate understanding and knowledge in the following areas of Emergency Medical Responder patient care:

1. Preparatory: EMS Systems, Workforce Safety & Wellness, Lifting & Moving Patients, Medical, Legal, and Ethical Issues, Communications & Documentation, and Anatomy & Physiology (Human Body) components.
2. Airway: Management of the patient airway, and professional rescuer CPR.
3. Patient Assessment: Assessing the injured and sick patient.
4. Medical Emergencies, including general and specific medical conditions, infectious diseases & epidemics, poisoning and substance abuse, behavioral emergencies, environmental emergencies. Students will be able to treat the patients with medical emergencies.
5. Trauma Emergencies, including bleeding, shock, and soft-tissue injuries, and injuries to muscles and bones.
6. Childbirth emergencies.
7. Pediatric emergencies.
8. Geriatric emergencies.
9. EMS Operations, including transport operations, vehicle extrication & special rescue, and incident management.

TERMINAL LEARNING OBJECTIVES

At the completion of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Recognize the nature and seriousness of the patient's condition, extent of injuries, and assess the need for emergency medical care.
2. Administer appropriate emergency medical care based on assessment findings of the patient's condition.
3. Lift, move, position, and otherwise handle the patient to minimize discomfort and prevent further injury.
4. Carry out the duties of an Emergency Medical Responder (EMR) in a timely and safe manner.

PROGRAM OBJECTIVES:

Upon successful completion of this program, the graduate will be able to:

1. Demonstrate the ability to comprehend, apply, analyze, and evaluate information relevant to their role as an entry level EMR (Cognitive).
2. Demonstrate technical proficiency in all skills necessary to fulfill the role as an entry level EMR (Psychomotor).
3. Demonstrate personal behaviors consistent with professional and employer expectations for an entry level EMR (Affective).



SUCCESSFUL COURSE COMPLETION REQUIREMENTS

The standard at SJC EMS always meets or exceeds Emergency Responder National Standard Curriculum, Joint Organization of Education, and New Mexico EMS Guidelines.

Examinations measure your academic mastery of material. You will only have one attempt per exam to demonstrate your knowledge. All exams will be taken on CANVAS. Failing 2 block exams with a percentage less than 70%, will result in dismissal from the course.

Successful completion of this course means satisfying the following requirements:

1. 70% or better overall academic grade.
2. 70% or better on the academic course final.
3. 70% or better on skills/scenario testing.
4. Affective Competency
5. Current AHA BLS/CPR Healthcare Provider card

You must achieve a 70% on your final exam to move on to Final Practical testing and NATIONAL CERTIFICATION

EXAMINATIONS and QUIZZES:

There will be a total of four (4) Block exams and (1) final Block exam, as well as a Pharmacology exam and a Pharm final during the semester. All exams will be given on CANVAS. These exams will be opened for a period of time, as designated on your schedule. All exam will be taken in class and have a set time limit for each exam. You cannot open the exam and walk away, so please ensure that when you sit down to complete the exam you are prepared to complete it with no interruptions. Examinations measure your academic mastery of material. You will have one opportunity to pass each test.

There are 21 Chapter quizzes and 7 drug quizzes that are REQUIRED to complete the course. Drug quizzes are due on the date noted in the semester schedule, BY START OF CLASS. Chapter quizzes are due BY START OF CLASS on the days when they will be lectured. Failure to complete these quizzes on time will result in a ZERO grade for the quiz and you will still have to complete them to pass the class. So, it is in the students best interest to complete them on time.

In addition, students whose lack of attendance affects their performance in the program are subject to dismissal from the program. Attendance is mandatory for each class topic because of the serious nature of the material discussed and the competency demanded in performing the skills, absences therefore, must be judged on an individual basis. The points will be deducted as follows:

1. Late for class – loss of 1 point
2. Leaving early from class – loss of 1 point
3. Absent for Tuesday ,Thursday, or Saturday class – loss of 2 points
