

Course Time Commitment

You should anticipate 2 to 3 hours per credit of active course work; this includes reading, studying, online work (quizzes, assignments, and discussion posting), and face-to-face class attendance. Some students may need more, others less. For this semester, students should plan on spending 26 to 39 hours a week when not attending face-to-face sessions, and up to 50 hours during those weeks where

face-to-face attendance is required. We will greatly reduce online courses during those weeks students are in the classroom, but we cannot eliminate all online work.

Canvas Participation and Expectations

You are required to have access to the Internet. CANVAS is the college's platform of choice used to administer chapter quizzes, exams, discussions, and evaluations. CANVAS is also the main software program used to communicate and remain in regular contact with students. CANVAS allows us to track performance, log-ins, grades, and test scores of each student, while at the same time, keeping the student informed and up-to-date with the class. There will be deadlines to meet and you will be required to log in to CANVAS on a regular basis, a minimum of 3 times a week. It is the student's responsibility to make sure he/she can log in, and that his/her computer has all green checks according to the system check on the CANVAS login page (http://CANVAS.sanjuancollege.edu). Participation and Attendance Policy

ATTENDANCE

Due to the critical nature of the material to be taught, IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT ALL CLASSES BE ATTENDED! Attendance and time management is an AFFECTIVE BEHAVIOR criteria, and insufficiency in this affective area is grounds for disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal. In addition, students whose lack of attendance affects their performance in the program are subject to dismissal from the program. Attendance is mandatory for each class topic because of the serious nature of the material discussed and the competency demanded in performing the skills. Absences, therefore, must be judged on an individual basis.

You may call the main office and leave a message with the Administrative Assistant, who will in turn, convey the information to the appropriate instructors.

Each student is only allowed a maximum absence of 8 hours.

If a student faces exceeding the maximum allowed absences of 8 hours, that student MAY have the following options available:

- 1. One-on-one tutoring (at an additional cost to the student)
- 2. Outside class arrangements (with the instructor and/or coordinator)
- 3. Attending another class (if another class is available)
- 4. To utilize any of the options above, arrangements MUST BE MADE AT LEAST 2 WEEKS IN ADVANCE (prior to planned absence), in writing, with the instructor and/or coordinator or director! The request will be reviewed and considered before approval is granted. None of these options are guaranteed. They are only available to the student based on instructor availability and discretion. The instructor's decision is based upon the instructor's ability to monitor the student, the effect on the rest of the class, the student's commitment to the class, and whether this is an isolated incident/event versus an ongoing problem. No more than 8 hours of additional missed time will be allowed; IF THE INSTRUCTOR can accommodate the needs of the student (with an option from the list above), ONLY 8 additional hours will be "made up" per the options above. Again, to reiterate, this is NOT a guaranteed procedure, and, if not, the student is eligible for dismissal from the program based on the attendance policy.

Online Course Fee

Online Courses - San Juan College requires all online courses to include some form of assessment to demonstrate the mastery of course objectives. This could include exams, capstone projects, e-

portfolios, presentations, final papers or other appropriate assessments. The use of a proctoring platform, plagiarism detection software or other method to ensure that assessments are completed by the enrolled student is required.

A course fee of \$5.00 is assessed for all online courses at San Juan College to cover the cost of the above services.
