The course will use a communicative approach to reinforce and expand the fundamentals of basic vocabulary, grammar, conversation, and culture. Lecture and lab components.

1. Communicative strategies

Increase your understanding of the Spanish language; develop your communicative skills in listening, speaking, reading, and writing, and apply them to a wider variety of real-life situations in the following contexts:

- * Talking about historical and personal events that happened in the past
- * Talking about taking trips and traveling
- * Ordering food at a restaurant
- * Giving instructions
- * Discussing the environment
- * Commenting on vacation activities
- * Talking about feelings and mental conditions and health-related issues

2. Grammar

Compare the target language with English, and, thus, enhance your appreciation for basic linguistic concepts.

- a) Demonstrate the ability to use, combine, and integrate the following grammatical structures into meaningful sentences:

- * Articles, nouns, prepositions, adjectives, and interrogative words
- * Present tense of regular, irregular, “yo” irregular, and stem-changing verbs
- * Reflexive pronouns and verbs
- * Present progressive
- * Direct and indirect object pronouns
- * Gustar and similar verbs
- * Preterit tense to express the past
- * Imperfect tense to express what used to be done and conditions in the past
- * Present perfect tense to express what has happened
- * Commands to give instructions
- * Subjunctive mood to express wishes and desires

b) Analyze and compare cognates, word order, and syntactical functions, morphological components such as prefixes, suffixes, and verb conjugations.

c) Use formal and informal language.

a) Increase intercultural awareness and understanding by exploring the diversity of the Spanishspeaking world and develop critical thinking skills by making analytical cross-cultural comparisons.
