CATALOG DESCRIPTION

A reading course combining introductory and middle level reading skills. Course focuses on fluency, word knowledge, and fundamental reading skills and strategies applied to different types of readings, including textbooks. Improving reading speed is also covered. Successful completion of this course (C or better) requires no other developmental (remedial) reading course.

Prerequisites: Appropriate Accuplacer score and TABE score

COURSE LEARNING OUTCOMES

1. To increase reading fluency: Students will have an opportunity to tape oral readings and practice at home.

2. To expand word knowledge

- a. Students will learn frequently occurring word parts.
- b. Students will learn and apply context clues to help understand unfamiliar words in exercises and readings
- c. Students will select appropriate dictionary definitions that fit the specific context of a word.

3. To increase comprehension and critical reading skills

- a. Students will identify
 - 1) main ideas in paragraphs: stated and implied
 - 2) central points in readings
 - 3) Key supporting Details
 - 4) Inferences

b. Students will

- 1) Distinguish the difference between facts and opinions
- 2) Demonstrate understanding of the connotation of words
- 3) Identify purpose, tone, and logical fallacies (propaganda and errors in thinking)
- c. When given an introduction to several approaches to reading content-area texts, students will use appropriate reading strategies to include previewing, monitoring comprehension, using fix-up strategies, and reflecting. (LTC)

4. To introduce basic study strategies

- a. Students fill out master schedules, term schedules, and daily schedules
- b. Students will learn and apply rote memory skills using index cards
