

SYLLABUS ENER 218 Gas Measurement Witnessing .5 credits

CATALOG DESCRIPTION:

Course presents basic principles of gas measurement with a focus on the witnessing function. Instruction provides students with gas measurement terminology and references to industry standards that promote effective communication regarding witnessing and potential gas measurement issues. By understanding gas measurement witnessing techniques and responsibilities, students will be able to perform basic gas meter and gas sampling witnessing functions.
