

AUBO-245-ADVANCED NON-STRUCTURAL REPAIR II 4 CREDITS

SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This course is a continuation of AUBO 244 with infuses in all phases of minor non-structural damage repair. The student will be instructed in sheet metal repair and panel alignment as well as the R&I of automotive glass and related components.
