

EDUC 209-EVALUATION AND IEP 3 CREDITS

SYLLABUS

CATALOG DESCRIPTION

This course is an overview of the continuum of special education practices, IEP implementation and a brief overview of the diagnostic evaluation process in regards to identifying students who qualify for special education services. The course will provide teachers with an understanding of the continuum of services options in relation to specific disabilities and best practices for provision of services. The course will also include proper IEP development, implementation and documentation of services and basic knowledge in the area of eligibility criteria.
